Student Court Renders Decision

The Student Court rendered its decision recently in the first Constitutional Interpretation Case to be brought before the court.

The case was concerned with Article VII of the Student Association Constitution dealing with elections.

The pervading question was whether the Senate has the power to regulate all campus-wide elections whether instituted by the Student Government or not. The Court held that the Senate did have the right to regulate elections by private organization if they were campus-wide.

Justice Michael Baker wrote the majority opinion

of the court. Chief Justice Warren Weber announced the decision in the Student Association versus Representatives Case. Gerald Duff argued for the respondent and Frank Myers presented the plaintiff's case.
